USA'S HISTORIC ROUTE 66

Arguably the most famous road trip of all time, Route 66 ran from Chicago, Illinois to Los Angeles, California until it was sadly decommissioned in 1985. Now dubbed 'Historic Route 66' much of the original track can still be navigated (though it's not the most straightforward of routes) and many tour operators offer flydrive holidays, making it possible to experience this legendary highway for yourself in 2008.



AUSTRALIA'S GREAT OCEAN ROAD

The vast and varied land of Australia is teaming with road trip options. Winding their way along the country's dramatic coastlines or through the desolate outback, you can choose from routes which stretch up the tropical East coast or take you into the more temperate state of Victoria. The Great Ocean road begins near the cultural city of Melbourne and meanders its way past 400 kilometres of sleepy fishing villages, stunning coastal scenery and expansive woodland. NORWAY'S ATLANTIC ROAD

The Atlantic Road in Norway is one of the world's little known road trips marvels. This relatively short road weaves its way across 12 bridges which jut out over the ocean, linking various small islands between Kristiansund and Molde (famed for its annual jazz festivals).

During fine weather this stretch is a fantastic area for spotting whales and seals, while in stormier weather its dramatic waves attract travellers from far and wide.

With Scandinavian Airlines opening a direct service from Bristol international Airport to Oslo starting on 30th March now is the ideal time to explore Norway's Atlantic Road. (Flights from £29 one way, book via www.flysas.co.uk or call 0871 521 2772). We recommend renting a car (www.scandinaviancarrental. com charge £242 for 1 weeks hire) purchasing a trusty Norwegian road map and traveling from Oslo via Bergen and up to Kristiansund, which takes in glaciers, breathtaking fjords, sand dunes and thriving cities in just 6-10 days.

ITALY'S AMALFI COAST

Small windy coastal roads, rows of charming pastel coloured houses, and mile upon mile of sparkling blue ocean – the Amalfi Coast is every bit the embodiment of quaint Italian sophistication. Spend your days leisurely exploring the crumbling


white washed churches then dine alfresco by candlelight and savour the subtle zesty fragrances carried on the wind from the regions many lemon groves.

The Amalfi Coast is every driving enthusiasts dream – the road twists and turns (sometimes unexpectedly!) for miles and miles with striking panoramic views on all sides.
