How to get

Top 10 things you need to know about getting an internship or graduate job...

and why you need to start thinking about it now!

You've worked hard and are now studying at a great university. So, what next?

At Bright Network, we speak to hundreds of talented students every week. Not only do they have sterling academics and an array of extra-curricular activities to their name, but also possess excellent communication skills to boot.

Nevertheless, despite being superb candidates, so many struggle when it comes to landing that all-important internship or graduate job. Why? Too few students understand the timings and intricacies of the recruitment season.

DON'T PANIC!

It's completely acceptable for you to have no idea about what you want to do with your life, or what jobs exist that you may a) enjoy b) be great at. (Of course, hopefully you will find both). The most successful careers often start that way. Don't worry if you have no idea 'what you want to do with your life' – it's an evolving process and you'll work out it out in the end.

START EARLY

Having said 'don't panic', it is a good idea to start thinking about what you enjoy doing and developing a strong sense of self-awareness. What do you really enjoy doing? Do you love numbers? Does a great day involve meeting lots of new people? Do you love nothing better than planning and organising something? Do you enjoying helping others?



These self-observations could help you decide what business function may be a best fit. For example, if you like organising things, a career in operations may be the way forward, or if you like meeting people, business development may be something to explore. People normally excel in their jobs when they're doing things they like.

3 THERE IS A YEARLY RECRUITING CYCLE - DON'T MISS OUT

Although it's fine for you to take your time to find the thing you want to do, you need to be aware that the timing of the yearly graduate recruitment cycle is absolutely critical. Every year talented students miss out on opportunities because they've missed key application deadlines.

As a quick rule of thumb – you will need to apply for an internship or graduate role in the autumn term to start work the following year, so if you miss that critical deadline you will have to wait another year.

Most internships are for penultimate year students, so you do them in the summer of your second year if you're on a three year course, or the summer of your third year if you're on a four year course. For first year programmes that take place in the Easter holidays, again you will normally have to apply in the autumn term.

FIRMS ARE HIRING Don't believe the press hype. The best firms are hiring thousands of the best graduates every year and there are lots of jobs out there. If you're good enough and better than the competition, you'll be successful.

5 KNOW ABOUT THE BIG PLAYERS Most graduate jobs are in four main sectors – these are Consulting, Commercial Law, Investment Banking and Professional Services. Within these four sectors are the major recruiters you will hear about on campus - for example, Accenture, PwC, Slaughter and May – so it's probably worth knowing more about the four main sectors and what the work in those sectors involves. And remember, within each of the core sectors there are a variety of different roles. For example, you could do an operations role in Banking, or a public sector-focused role in Professional Services.

6 EMPLOYERS HAVE A 'TALENT PIPELINE'

Gone are the days of employers opening up vacancies solely to final year students. Most of the best jobs are now filled through internships with employers 'trying before they buy.' Increasingly, firms take students into the firm for an internship (often seen as an extended job interview, normally in the summer holidays) and then making offers to the interns that excel.

APPLY EARLY Firms normally recruit on a 'rolling process' – i.e. filling their vacancies as they have their applications coming in. However, most applicants apply too late, leaving lots of applicants chasing the few unfilled vacancies. The solution is to apply as soon as the firm opens its application process – this can be as early as July for internship and graduate roles to start the following summer.



8 GET AS MUCH WORK EXPERIENCE AS YOU CAN

In short, there is no 'perfect answer' to your career direction and the only way to find out if you're going to enjoy working in a particular sector, firm or role, is to try it. Get as much experience as possible to see what you really enjoy – working out what you don't want to do is just as important as figuring out what you do want to do. And work experience will always help strengthen your CV.

For First Years, 'Spring Weeks' (internships offered by Investment Banks in the Easter holidays) can be a great way to get some structured experience even if you're not sure banking is right for you.

Even if you're just getting experience in a local business at home during the holidays, this is good for your CV. The worst thing you can do is leave the job hunt until your final year and have no experience under your belt. The competition will have taken all the best jobs and you could be left high and dry.

9 SMALL FIRMS HIRE A LOT OF GRADUATES

SMEs (Small and Medium-Sized Enterprises that hire less than 250 people) are significant employers of bright graduates. Lots of high-growth businesses are keen to find great entrepreneurial talent to drive their businesses forward, so keep these on your radar.

10 ALWAYS BE NETWORKING AND ASKING FOR ADVICE

You're not the first bright mind to be keen to learn about the world of work and the different options available. People are always keen to help and give advice so don't be afraid to suggest a meeting. Offer to buy someone a coffee and go armed with a list of questions about how they've got to where they are today.

Most successful people are successful for a reason and are only too happy to share their insights to help others. Always follow up with a note of thanks, by email or by post.

The BRIGHT Interview

An inside look at the Finance industry from Fidelity Investment Director Tom Stevenson.

Tom Stevenson, Director, Fidelity Investment

Here, Tom offers his insights on the state of the Finance industry and how it will affect graduates.

How is the industry changing and how will this affect people entering the industry?

There are a lot of regulatory, political and social changes that are re-shaping the way in which people save for retirement and manage their finances. These changes allow people more freedom to manage their money, and as such people are becoming more actively engaged in how they do this. Our role as an industry is to provide partnership and guidance to people in a way that is different to before.

Previously, we provided a service, however this has now become an engaged partnership. The biggest change for the industry is the shift from final salary pensions to defined contribution pensions. We are having to go down an American model, with more engagement in personal finances throughout people's lives.

In the past, individuals managed their finances through going to work and receiving a pension. As this has changed, the relationship between the Financial Services Industry and its customers has become much closer. This means that categorically, people involved in the business need to be completely customer focused, thinking about the products we produce and the services we provide from the customer perspective at all times.

When entering the industry, one must remember that we are catering to all different types of customers at different stages in their lives.



You've written about how millennials expect different things from employers compared to Gen X/ baby boomers. What effect will this have on the industry?

Young people are now much more interested in doing something worthwhile – this is an important distinction between asset management and other areas of financial services. At the heart of what we do as an industry, our purpose is to provide solutions to improve people's lives.

We are successful if we create better outcomes. Having this interest and values driven focus on your work can only have a positive impact on the industry. When I moved from journalism into financial services, it was absolutely crucial that I was going into an industry that I believed in.

In addition to this, millennials have a sense of developing themselves – training and learning are both really important. As an industry, if we are to hold on to and attract the best, then we must create an environment where people can develop themselves, and not just "do a job."

One of the great things about the Fidelity graduate scheme is that it is a 2.5 year programme where different assignments are completed. This gives graduates a real feel of the breadth of what we do.

Finally, as an industry we need to think about the fact that millennials have a different attitude to flexibility and work/life balance. We need to be flexible to this and embrace the changing trends.



What advice can you give to students approaching the industry from a nonfinancial/economics background? Do they need to catch up to the rest or should they embrace being different?

I have an English degree. Quite a lot of our Portfolio Managers have arts degrees. There is a level of knowledge which you need to get up to speed to. The skills which you learn as a Humanities or Arts graduate are completely transferable to Investment Management.

Investment Management is essentially about the world around us - understanding the world, making sense of

the world around us and interpreting the world. These skills can be gleaned in many different ways across various disciplines. What will make you successful in our world, is being able to think creatively, laterally and in an unusual way.

What is the ideal candidate? How, if at all, has it changed over the last 15 years?

What has changed is the pace of the industry, and therefore the need to think creatively and to be adaptable to change. In the last few years, there has been enormous change sweeping through the industry. The expectations of our customers are changing very quickly. We need to respond creatively in a very competitive market place. The only way we can do that is to be very adaptable, to try new things, not to be afraid of failure.

The ideal candidate will be comfortable in an environment that exists as a network rather than a hierarchical environment. You must be able to demonstrate an ease with an unstructured, unpredictable environment. What we are looking for is someone with a creative, problem solving mind-set.

What is the best way to keep up with commercial developments in the field?

It is very important to read widely and be alert to change. Prior to the financial crisis, it was easy to ignore what was going on in our world.

However, the financial services industry is now front and centre. Be aware of the news agenda and the headlines, and read widely around that.

Is the industry doing enough to encourage strong female candidates? Does it need to do more?

The numbers probably suggest that the industry is not doing as much as it could. As a business, we take it very seriously. Only last week I was at a meeting where one of our senior managers took away an action to follow this up and drive through opportunities for women.

We have a women's network that promotes the careers of women within Fidelity. It is still a male dominated industry (figures would suggest), which is a shame as there is lots of evidence to suggest that a diverse management set is a more effective one, so I do think the industry has got some way to go.

How can students prepare themselves for the rigours of the industry? What skills are especially important?

Like any industry, be prepared to work hard, be flexible, be open minded, creative and adaptable - these things will set you in good stead.

I do think it is a great industry to work in - what we do is genuinely worthwhile, and it is unbelievably intellectually stimulating. If you're interested in the world around you and the themes and trends that are driving the way that we live, then you are interested in investment. Ever changing, stimulating and worthwhile - it is a great industry to explore.

10 soft skills that employers want:

The ability to demonstrate your 'soft' skills however during an application process is crucial. So just what are the top 'soft' skills employers look for in successful hires? We've pulled together the top ten.

VERBAL COMMUNICATION

Verbal communication is vital for liaising with colleagues and clients, so you need to be able to show a future employer that you can listen, understand instructions, and put your point across in an effective way. Employers need to know that you are able to change your style of communication to suit the task in hand. This is an invaluable skill, and can lead to key business successes, whether you're handling conflict or persuading customers of the benefits of your product or service. If you can develop constructive and meaningful relationships with colleagues, this leads to a healthy and productive working environment.

TEAMWORK

A good team player will have clear goals and is willing to work with others to achieve them. It is important to be open, honest, and offer constructive suggestions whilst listening to others. You should be able to show teamwork in various different ways, be it examples of previous work experience or your extra-curricular activities. It isn't always about being a leader either, or a follower, it's about understanding the situation and being able to work with others to take appropriate action. Taking initiative shows a willingness to get stuck in and become involved in business activity.

COMMERCIAL AWARENESS

Having commercial awareness is a crucial soft skill, as it shows you are conscious of external factors that affect an organisation. This means that you have the passion and interest to find out more about the field in which an organisation operates. You might do this by reading around the subject, and by having an ability to talk about how current affairs impact the industry you are going into.

INITIATIVE

Are you the person that is willing to take the first step? Taking initiative shows a willingness to get stuck in and become involved in business activity. You will be the person who is willing to come up with ideas but also someone who can put them into action. Having initiative means you will be keen to see successful change within management, and you won't be afraid to be the person that kicks this off.

ORGANISATION

It might sound obvious to say it, but organisation is a skill for which employers are hungry. You must be able to plan activities and prepare your work load. This is a pre-requisite when working with others and scheduling work to particular time frames. You need to be someone who can be relied upon to deliver projects and information in a logical and controlled way. Demonstrate your ability to show well-structured work which always arrives on time.

If you do it right, you'll attend events that teach you more about your industry and meet people who share your interests - with the added bonus that you'll have friends on hand when you need help. Read on for some top tips to make you a comfortable, confident and successful networker.

FIND NETWORKING GROUPS THAT SUIT YOU

Joining a group gives you an instant pool of people to network with. The obvious groups are the trade organisations such as the Institute of Engineering and Technology. At the early stages of your career, though, that's not necessarily your cup of tea. You'll find that there are many smaller, more flexible groups that you can dip into depending on your interests. The Meetup website (meetup.com) is a great place to start looking.

GAUGE YOUR COMFORT LEVEL For the introverts among us, networking can be intimidating. Remember, you don't have to throw yourself in at the deep end. If you don't feel like a natural networker, try looking for a structured event such as a talk or a workshop. Go along intending to learn something and let the networking aspect take a back seat. As you get more confident you can make more of an effort to interact.

MAKE A GOOD FIRST IMPRESSION Whether you're at a formal dinner or a meet up in a pub, there are a few very simple things you can do

to make that first impression count.

- Practise your handshake. Grip firmly, make direct eye contact and try to make sure your palms are dry. (There are antiperspirants designed for hands!)
- · Introduce yourself with confidence. The "fake it 'til you make it" technique really does work.
- Get the conversation going. After the introductions, a simple next step is to tell the person why you decided to talk to them.
- · Have plenty of business cards to hand. You don't want to dig in your wallet the whole time, so try keeping your cards in your pockets, or in a card case in your handbag.
- · Think before you speak. A couple of seconds' pause will barely register with your listener, even if it feels awkward to you.

THINK ABOUT WHAT YOU **CAN OFFER**

You'll make more friends if you approach networking by thinking about what you can give, not what you can get. Everyone likes a person who helps them out, Keep an eye out for things you can do, such as introducing someone to a colleague or tipping them off about a job opportunity. It'll build stronger connections than small talk can.

VOLUNTEER OR SPEAK AT EVENTS

Volunteering as a host or helper at an event gives you a reason to speak to everyone. For even better visibility, keep an eye out for events where you can give a talk or run a workshop. Get advice from the event organisers about what would work best, and make sure you're well-prepared on the day.



LOG YOUR CONTACTS AND FOLLOW UP

After a successful networking event, you'll come away with a handful of names, email addresses or business cards. Set yourself a time to go through and log people's details or add them on Facebook or LinkedIn. Then choose who to follow up with and how you'll do it.

PAY ATTENTION TO YOUR **KEY CONTACTS**

As an effective networker you'll guickly build up more contacts than you can easily handle. It's important to be selective. Try making a list of 10-20 people you think are really worth staying in touch with. Once you've narrowed it down, you can give them more attention. Check in with them every few months, even if it's just a friendly email asking how they are.

DEVELOP A THICK SKIN

You're not going to click with everyone you meet. Don't obsess over an unanswered email. Try contacting the person again; possibly you caught them at a bad time. Then move on to the next person on your list.



What is commercial awareness and why it matters:

Commercial awareness has become a buzzword over the last few years. Regardless of industry or sector, employers are keen to see that you understand and engage with the world outside of the university bubble.

So, what is commercial awareness?

Commercial awareness is an understanding of how industries and businesses work. It's about knowing what's going on in the world and analysing the way it might impact on your chosen sector and company.

If you're thinking about Law for example, you'll need to know how the legal sector operates, who the major players are, what recent economic, political or regulatory changes might have impacted the industry and what emerging challenges or opportunities for the industry might be. If it's marketing, advertising or media in which you're interested, you'll need to know the latest advertising deals, success of recent campaigns and movements within the industry.

Stay switched on & up-to-date

It's easy in the midst of term-life to not look beyond the university paper and for 'news' to refer to the latest activities on campus. Staying up-to-date doesn't have to be long and laborious, nor does it mean reading the FT cover to cover on a daily basis.

An excellent first port of call is Radio 4's Today programme - their flagship news and current affairs programme. As well as telling you what's happening in the world, this

programme often sets the news agenda. It's on from 6am until 9am, but with iPlayer, there's no excuse for those of you who aren't early risers. Other programmes on Radio 4 to look out for are Evan Davies' business conversations programme, The Bottom Line - great for gaining insights into strategy and business and The Media Show - all about the fast-changing media world.

Another excellent tip is to sign up for Google Alerts for top companies and leaders so that you receive breaking news directly to your inbox.

Get to know the lingo, the companies and the experts

Every industry has a set of major players, commentators and industry experts. Do your research and get familiar with

these so that you recognise key names and influencers. One of the best ways in which you can get to grips with a particular sector is to join sector-focused university societies and/or commercial awareness clubs. Take advantage of what university can offer you - reading about news and current affairs is only one part of it – you need to get used to talking about it too and that's where societies can come in.

Have a point of view

Knowing the facts about an industry is important but having a sound point of view on them will help you to stand out further. Citing detailed regulatory changes is all well and good but what do you think it means for the industry? Is it good or bad and if you were CEO, what would you do?

Start applying a spot of analytical thinking - and you'll soon find yourself becoming more informed.

Do it yourself - get some experience

One of the best ways to learn more about an industry is to work in it. Whether it's an insight day or a week-long

placement, experience helps you to better understand how a company and sector works. In addition, you'll strengthen your CV and start to identify whether you're suited to and enjoy working in that industry.

Look for the links between news stories and its impact on particular sectors and companies.

The path to SUCCESS

Follow in the footsteps of five successful Bright Network members who secured sought-after positions at leading firms Clifford Chance, JP Morgan, PwC, EY and UBS. They share their stories here.

Benjamin

Trainee Solicitor, Clifford Chance STUDIED: LAW. CARDIFF UNIVERSITY

Why did you choose Clifford Chance?

Having met Clifford Chance on about four different occasions throughout my first two years at university, I knew they were the right law firm for me. The inclusive, friendly and teamorientated culture really stood them apart from other firms. I wanted to join a firm where I could receive great training and do top quality work but in a supportive environment and Clifford Chance seemed to fit this.

Tell us about the application process

For Clifford Chance, the application process involves an online application comprising of the normal questions and then a critical reasoning test. If you pass this test, Graduate Recruitment guarantee to read your application. If they like your application they will invite you to an assessment day. This firstly includes a Watson Glasier test prior to the assessment day, and then on the day itself, one case study interview, and one competency based interview.

What did you find was the most difficult part of the application process?

For me the most difficult parts were the Watson Glasier test and then the case study interview. I was really nervous about the test. I spent a lot of time preparing and understanding what the test required of me. I even had in front of me the structure of the test so I knew what was coming next.

On the assessment day the case study interview was rather tough because I didn't know what to expect and you only have ten minutes to prepare your answer which you then have to present to two partners. Obviously this means the adrenaline is running but it also means that you have to work very quickly and come up with a logical structure of how to present your answer. This was hard at first, but once you're in the interview and start discussing the case study, things become easier.

What was the most enjoyable part of the application process?

I found the competency based interview the most enjoyable part of the process. This was because I felt relatively confident in talking about why I am suited to Clifford

Chance and what I had gained from previous experiences. I also had a lot to talk about in regards to the new managing partner, this led us to discuss his appointment for most of the interview and talk about the firm's strategy for the future.

How did you prepare for the application process?

For the online application form I made sure I thoroughly researched the firm and knew how I personally related to everything I had researched. I attended many different networking events

where I would ask Clifford Chance representatives different questions to help me write my application. Additionally I also started to read the business press every day, as well as the legal press surrounding Clifford Chance. This enabled me to include anything relevant in my application and show how well prepared I was. The last thing I did was to get a few people to proof read my application and give me their opinions on its content; this really helped and did result in a few changes.

For the assessment day I wrote a small preparation booklet, of about seven or eight pages compromising of what I thought I needed to learn for the interview. This included questions I thought I may be asked, recent Clifford Chance deals, important business stories, how my experiences related to Clifford Chance and key deals I had been following. This booklet really helped me and I was constantly updating it up until I took the train to London for the interview.

Top three tips you give to someone who wanted to follow in your footsteps?

- Build a rapport with the firm you think you may be applying to. As mentioned I met Clifford Chance on many different occasions and always followed up with emails to the people I had met. This led to me building up contacts and being able to use them to further my research.
- 2 For Clifford Chance specifically, when writing the online application form I would do it with their list of competencies in front of you. A list of these can be found online and it really helps to focus your writing on what Clifford Chance is looking for and how your experiences fit with that. It is also a useful tool for seeing if Clifford Chance really is the right fit for you.
- 3 For the assessment day, it is advisable that you always stick to what you're saying. The case study interview is all about your opinion and if you fail to show you can stick to it, you could come across as an indecisive individual, who does not believe in their own ability. Clearly if what you're arguing is illogical and blatantly wrong then don't stick to it, but if you're being challenged on something you've said in the interview (as I was multiple times), then it is preferable to stick to it and give a robust defence as to why. This shows that you're an individual who can think competently under pressure and still articulate your answers well.



Sophie

Spring Weeks at JP Morgan and Citi STUDIED: LAW, LSE

Tell us a little bit about your experience

I attended Bright Network: Investment Banking Top 100. I enjoyed the event a lot and found it really useful especially coming from a law background. Most people I meet who are interested in this career have studied maths or economics, so it was very helpful to meet bankers who were from a background like mine. It also helped to speak to people from different areas of the companies and find out what skills were required for the various jobs.

I really felt it made me more qualified to submit applications, as well as demystifying the whole process, which can be quite intimidating. Recruiters gave advice on what to put on your application and what skills you needed to demonstrate to be successful. I also realised how much faster I was able to pick up all this information hearing it in person rather than just reading it on their website, where it is also available.

I got a sense of how much the event helped too when loads of my friends who hadn't gone felt like they were behind and sought me out to help them in their applications.

Can you tell us about your application process to the Spring Weeks?

I applied for quite a lot; as well at JP Morgan and Citi I also got offers from other banks but was unable to attend them because of clashes.

As soon as I applied, I was remembering the advice and talks at the event. Since I was making so many applications I started early and made sure to set personal deadlines for submitting them. It helped to remember the firms I had most enjoyed talking to when I was narrowing down my choices, so I applied to those ones first as a priority.

I also looked for as many other events as possible to attend, like open days or networking events. I really wanted to get as much advice and as many contacts as possible. The important thing was then to mention these (relevant) events in my applications; it's good to look keen.

Can you tell us about your Spring Week experience?

It involved a lot of shadowing; at JP Morgan I was allowed to choose which department I was interested in so I chose sales. They're a very market focused firm and I got a chance to do a bit of extra shadowing in that busy sector. I learnt about the role and the products traded, as well as seeing the specific qualities required for different positions.

I got to make a lot of contacts and was given a great overview of the all the programmes and roles available for summer internships and graduate positions too, which will be really useful once applications come round.

Top three tips you give to someone who wanted to follow in your footsteps?

- 1 Start early applications are processed on a rolling basis so they fill up very fast.
- 2 Don't overcomplicate your application just show the skills they are looking for and make sure you explain what you learned with every event or experience.
- 3 When it comes to phone interviews, be excited and confident, even if you aren't completely sure what they're talking about. That said, make sure you give honest opinions too, rather than just trying to say what you think they want to hear.

Tell us about your job

As a new starter on the Foundation for the Future graduate scheme offered by PwC, I will be joining a twoyear training programme as part of an intake of around 300. The first six weeks will be based at a specialist training school, with a further two weeks gaining client exposure. During this period, I will develop skills across a breadth of disciplines such as finance, risk and business strategy, whilst all the time hopefully making new contacts, friends and enjoying myself!

Following the introductory period, I will embark upon three-month rotations with clients for the rest of the two year period. This aims to develop a different skills set with each project and gain experience across a range of industries and sectors, which will hopefully aid me in deciding my long-term specialism within management consulting.

Why did you choose PwC?

PwC has always had a reputation as a professional services organisation with a very strong work ethic, but one that nurtures and aids development as well.

Having gained information about the organisation from a number of representatives, I found PwC provided exposure to a range of colleagues, clients and projects and this high level of diversity was really appealing to me. PwC ranking as the number one graduate employer for such a long period of time was very reassuring and a



great acknowledgement of the time, expertise, and energy which is invested into graduate careers.

Why Management Consultancy?

Management Consulting struck me as an area of business which is very dynamic and always evolving to provide a tailored service for the client and their individual and needs and requirements. I imagined that there would be a great deal of satisfaction and sense of reward when a project is completed to the optimum level and the client is satisfied with a strong strategy to improve performance.

Please tell us about the application process - what did you have to do?

The initial stage was a straightforward application, listing my personal and educational details and my motivations for working for PwC in the management consulting line of service. This was shortly followed by online numerical reasoning, verbal reasoning and personality tests, which involved a series of numerical or logic problems to be answered in a very constrained attributes that PwC period of time.

I was then given a telephone interview, lasting around 30 minutes, where I was asked questions based around the PwC core competencies. I reflected on my experiences of school, university and social situations, and related these to attributes that PwC look for in their applicants.

When I was successful at this stage I was invited to an assessment centre, which consisted of three tasks: written task; group task; and further tests (very similar to the initial online tests). There were around 10 other applicants there, all applying for different roles, in different lines of service, in different offices to me, so I did not feel like I was in competition with them; we were all in the same situation and so supported each other through the session. The written task involved the production of a business plan based upon information which was given to us about an organisation and their current business situation.

The group task involved discussion between a group of 5 of us about individual business proposals, which we had each been allocated, and we had to come to the conclusion as to which proposal should be recommended. The final tests were very similar to the first set of tests which I had completed at the first stage of my application, however there were only numerical and verbal reasoning questions.

After I completed this stage, I had then gained my place on the Summer Shadow a Female Leader Scheme, which was a week-long programme of intense shadowing of Senior Management Consultant. I had a great time, and learnt so much over the short period of one week with interaction with clients and members of the PwC team, from Associate to Partner level. Throughout this week I

> was closely monitored and was given a formal interview for the graduate role at the end. This was with a Partner from the office in which I had been based. This interview was less formal than the telephone interview and more like a conversation, and much of the interview was based around my experiences of the week and reflecting upon what I had learnt. However the interviewer still tested some of the core competencies and was keen to find out more about my interests and future aspirations within management consulting and PwC.

Following my success at this final stage interview, I was then offered the place on the graduate scheme.

What did you find was the most difficult part of the application process?

I found the telephone interview the most challenging part of my application, as I knew that this would be my first experience of making a personal impression upon the PwC recruiters. I was unsure what to expect, as this was my first telephone interview, and was apprehensive about not making an impact and not being a memorable candidate for the role. The PwC website was very helpful in my preparations, so I was able to tailor my responses to the competencies they look for in applicants, however there was always the concern of sounding too rehearsed and regimented with my answers.

What was the most enjoyable part of the application process?

I really enjoyed the group task of the assessment centre and feel that I learnt a lot from this exercise. It was important to find a way of conveying my thoughts to other individuals in the group concisely and with authority, whilst also considering the points which they were proposing. I really enjoyed listening to their arguments and then reflecting on these with the rest of the team to reach a logical outcome.

How did you prepare for the application process?

For each stage of the application process, I looked at the advice that was given on the PwC pages, and how they suggested that I could best prepare. I ensured that I

did plenty of numerical and verbal reasoning test practice before both the online tests and the assessment centre testing, as I knew that under the time pressure, I would perform far better if I was more accustomed with the question format.

As well as this, I used many of the resources provided on the

Bright Network website to prepare me for the various stages, especially how to make the best impression during my Shadow a Female Leader week, where I knew I would be meeting with many PwC employees. I found this an invaluable bank of advice and helpful tips, which really guided me through the process well.



Top three tips you give to someone who wanted to follow in your footsteps?

- Develop a really strong network of people through university careers fairs, sector careers fairs, Bright Network, LinkedIn, general acquaintances, family friends anyone! You never know how they could impact upon your prospects in the future.
- Attend as many workshops as you can. Most university careers centres run skills sessions to improve any aspect of your application that you think may be lacking. It's really useful to have a professional look over your application and CV before you send it off, as they will give a fresh insight into what you should include or remove. Further through the process, they will probably run sessions tailored towards assessment centres and offer you mock interviews. The preparation will make you feel so much more at ease and comfortable when you reach the real event, so nerves won't stop you from performing your best.
- **?** Make the most of any opportunity that you are given by an employer and enjoy it as much as you can, it could lead to so many opportunities. You might catch the eye of a recruiter after a stimulating conversation at a careers fair or at an insight day, and if you capitalise on this, they may invite you to interview or you could be fast-tracked.

Analyst at EY STUDIED: GEOGRAPHY, DURHAM UNIVERSITY

Why did you apply?

I chose this position with EY as it was a great chance to work for one of the largest and most established professional services firms in the world. It also gives me the opportunity to work with a wide variety of clients, whilst studying for my ACA qualification.

Please tell us about the application process – what did you have to do?

There were five stages to the application process and the whole process took me around three months to complete. It began with an application form followed by online tests. Once I had passed these stages I was invited to a first round strengths-based interview at the London Office. The manager who interviewed me focused on career motivation and my recognised strengths.

I received a phone call the following day and was invited to an assessment centre about three weeks later which involved a group exercise, analytical exercise, a retake of the tests and a lunch with a graduate. This was a really useful and interesting experience. The final Partner interview was my favourite part of the application process. It was more of a conversation about my career motivation, interest in the company and gave me a chance to ask any questions that I had. I received my offer the following day.

What did you find was the most difficult part of the application process?

The assessment centre was time pressured and challenging, however it was a useful exercise and gave me my first real opportunity to find out

- Use your contacts; friends, colleagues, other people that you know who have worked at the firm.
- 2 Keep up to date with business news and current affairs.
- 3 Fully research the role and company before you apply.

Graduate Analyst at UBS STUDIED: ECONOMICS, WARWICK UNIVERSITY

Tell us about your job

I successfully converted a summer internship at UBS into a full time graduate offer – in their Corporate Client Solutions department, the firm's Investment Banking Division (IBD). The graduate scheme started in July 2015 – with eight weeks of training.

Why did you choose this company and role?

I chose UBS as it is a prestigious bulge bracket Investment Bank. They have an extremely friendly and European corporate culture but there is no need for 'face time', when work is finished you leave.

There is a flat corporate structure – you can easily approach a managing director, senior member of staff and have opportunities to work with them as well as converse with them. There is no sense of hierarchy. All of this is combined with an ambitious environment that looks to push but not so much so that one breaks.

I was attracted to IBD, reasons include: the challenging nature of work, knowing that what you are doing is one of the hardest things to do, client facing and dealing with a variety of clients, receiving long term industry exposure, the varied nature of work, being at the forefront of tackling complex business problems, being part of industry changing transactions, great career progression and exit opportunities.

Please tell us about the application process – what did you have to do?

Initially I attended the Insight Day. I was fast-tracked to the Telephone Interview which was entirely competency based. The next stage was the Assessment Centre which tested Numerical skills, involved a presentation, one commercial interview, one competency interview and a Group Exercise. After this I received an offer for nine week summer internship. Based upon team and line manager's view on my performance and a presentation during the internship – I was offered a full time role.

What did you find was the most difficult part of the application process?

The Assessment Centre – interviews can be completely variable based upon the mood and seniority of the interviewer, you will never know what one expects/looks for.

What was the most enjoyable part of the application process?

Getting to ask questions of the interviewing personnel at the end of the interview...and of course getting the offer!

How did you prepare for the application process?

To prepare – I made sure I knew my CV and could elaborate on all experiences. I prepared competencies in the STAR format and tried to match them to UBS competencies and I followed news stories in depth– as you are asked about them from every angle.

Top three tips you give to someone who wanted to follow in your footsteps?

- Be clear, confident concise your answers to interview questions should be so clear that the interviewer knows exactly what you have said, almost as if they are bullet points.
- 2 Read the news everyday for a long time, it's much easier than doing it all at the last minute.
- When on the internship, treat as if it is an eight week job interview. Show interest in the sector, work, team – and be super enthusiastic. Enthusiasm can make up for a lot. Even if you don't like the work, you want to be in the position where you can say no to them rather than not even having the choice to say yes or no – hence getting the offer is super important.
