When the island is transformed into "Home Farm," a care facility run entirely by robots, Anna must navigate a world where the boundaries between human and machine blur dangerously.

With her robot companion Henry2 by her side, Anna uncovers a sinister end-of-life pathway called the "Right Way" and finds herself fighting for survival. In a dramatic escape that will keep readers gripped until the final page, Anna and Henry2 must outwit those who would decide when her life should end.

The Laughing Robot is a page-turning thriller that asks urgent questions: Can robots truly care? What does autonomy mean in old age? And who decides when our lives have value?
