




What is tall? Who knows any more – it's obviously the guy that dwarves you at the burger van, or blocks your view at the cinema – or maybe it's you?

# WOMEN WANT THEIR MEN TALL



One thing is for certain is that we are getting taller over time. According to scientists\* the average man has grown by four inches in the last century due to improvements in diet and public health. In 1900 a typical male was 5ft 6in tall, but by 2000 that had gone up to 5ft 10in. Over the same time women have grown by one-and-a-half inches, from just under 5ft 3in to just over 5ft 4in.

But is height as desirable as it once was deemed? Well as one of the UK's leading suppliers of clothes and accessories to tall men, we thought we ought to find out, which is why we commissioned a survey of over 1,200 men of all shapes, sizes, ages and heights to see what they think about tallness.

Our survey was commissioned and conducted throughout February and March 2013 and the results follow. All respondents were aged over 18 and UK based and the survey was conducted online.

We were intrigued by the results and we hope you will be too. Enjoy!






### HEIGHT MEN THINK WOMEN CONSIDER TO BE THE PERFECT HEIGHT




## MEN DO GET IT RIGHT!!!

## WOULD YOU DATE SOMEONE TALLER?


